USCGC ROBERT WARD Commissioning





The Alameda Council, NLUS is taking an active role in the Commissioning of the 30th Fast Response Cutter to be delivered to the US Coast Guard. The USCGC ROBERT WARD. The Coast Guard has asked - the Navy League, USCG supporters and the San Francisco Bay Area maritime community - to sponsor the commissioning of their newest Fast Response Cutter. The commissioning is planned for February 2, 2019, in the San Francisco Bay Area. FRCs are 154-foot multi-mission vessels with a crew of 24. Each has a range of 2,500 miles and is equipped for patrols of up to five days. Designed to conduct drug and migrant interdictions, port, waterway and coastal security operations, fisheries and environmental protection patrols, defense missions and search and rescue. They have been described as a computer in a ship's hull with the ability to see over the horizon.

We have an incredible opportunity to make a difference, and to show our continued appreciation for the 24/7 protection of our nation's ports and waterways, as well as providing for the ROBERT WARD and her crew. 
USCGC WAESCHE (WMSL 751)





In August, WAESCHE's dry dock period was reaching completion and the first day of Sea Trials was set for August 20th. At 1030 local time on August 20th, USCGC WAESCHE (WMSL-751) got underway from Vigor shipyard in Seattle for the first time in a year.

- Basic propulsion, steering, and systems tests were conducted in the Puget Sound.
- WAESCHE reached 30 + kts using the Combined Diesel and Gas Turbine propulsion mode. After reaching maximum speed, WAESCHE conducted an emergency stop test, halting the Cutter to full stop as fast as possible.
- WAESCHE conducted a full test of the Counter Measure Wash Down system.





- On September 20th, WAESCHE crewmembers spent their last morning in Seattle conducting drills and final preparations for the ready for sea certification and the transit back to Alameda.
- On the morning of Monday, September 24th, more than a year and a month since she left home, WAESCHE passed under the Golden Gate and Bay Bridge and moored up to Berth 3 at Coast Guard Island, Alameda. Throughout their time in Seattle, the crew of WAESCHE worked selflessly, striving to turn WAESCHE back into one the most mission capable vessels in the Coast Guard fleet.

Adopted Units

USCGC MUNRO (WMSL 755)

ALAMEDA, Calif. – The crew aboard Coast Guard Cutter Munro are scheduled to return Monday December 24th to their homeport in Alameda after a 105-day, 17,000-nautical mile, multi-mission deployment to the Western Pacific Ocean.

The crew conducted a Western Pacific Living Marine Resources patrol during the 105-day deployment. Munro's law enforcement teams conducted 10 at-sea inspections of foreign flagged fishing vessels on the high seas to counter illegal, unregulated and unreported fishing practices in the Western and Central Pacific Fisheries Commission area.

"The crew worked tirelessly to execute 10 fisheries boardings, 186 flight evolutions, and dozens of boat operations in support of fisheries enforcement which demonstrates U.S. presence in the Western Pacific," said Munro's commanding officer Capt. Jim Estramonte. "Munro's successful deployment paves the way for future Coast Guard Oceania patrols. Having the opportunity to bring the cutter to Guadalcanal, a place of Coast Guard lore, made the patrol even more meaningful for the crew."
