### USCGC Waesche (WMSL 751)

#### Change of Command for USCGC Waesche

On April 5, 2018 VADM Fred Midgette oversaw the time honored tradition of a change of command for the USCG National Security Cutter Waesche at which time CAPT James Passarelli was relieved as the Commanding Officer by CAPT Patrick Dougan.

#### Captain Patrick J. Dougan

#### Prospective Commanding Officer – USCGC Waesche (WMSL 751)

Captain Patrick J. Dougan reports to U. S. Coast Guard Cutter (USCGC) WAESCHE from U.S. Coast Guard Personnel Services Center in Washington, D.C. where he worked as the Officer Assignments Branch Chief (PSC-OPM2).

His first assignment after receiving a commission was as Deck Watch Officer and First Lieutenant in USCGC THETIS (WMEC 910) home ported in Key West, Florida. Subsequent afloat assignments include Weapons Officer, USCGC DALLAS (WHEC 716) in Charleston, South Carolina; Commanding Officer of USCGC SITKINAK (WPB 1329) and USCGC DRUM-MOND (WPB 1323) in Key West, Florida; Executive Officer in USCGC SPENCER (WMEC 905) in Boston, Massachusetts; then returning to Boston as Commanding Officer in USCGC ESCANABA (WMEC-907) Captain Dougan's previous shore assignments include Executive Officer of Coast Guard District Seven Tactical Law Enforcement Team, Miami, Florida; Nautical Science Instructor at the Coast Guard Academy in New London Connecticut; and within the Drug and Migrant Interdiction Division, Office of Maritime Law Enforcement (CG-MLE) at U.S. Coast Guard Headquarters.

Captain Dougan is a 1996 graduate of the U. S. Coast Guard Academy where he earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Management. He also holds a Master of Science in Organizational Leadership from Quinnipiac University located in Hamden, Connecticut. His personal awards include three Meritorious Service Medals, four Coast Guard Commendation Medals, one Coast Guard Achievement Medal, and one Commandant's Letter of Commendation. Captain Dougan is a permanent Cutterman, having served in the cutter fleet for more than 10 years. Captain Dougan is a native of Marlborough, Connecticut, and is married to the former Ms. Leontine DeGalan of Rotterdam, The Netherlands. They have two sons Connor (12) and Trevor (10).
