Center for Maritime Strategy A Partnership with the Navy League of the United States



Admiral James G. Foggo, U.S. Navy (Ret.) Dean, Center for Maritime Strategy

Admiral James G. Foggo, U.S. Navy (ret.), is the Dean of the Center for Maritime Strategy. He is a 1981 graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy. ADM Foggo is also an Olmsted Scholar and Moreau Scholar, earning a Master of Public Administration at Harvard University and a Diploma d 'Etudes Approfondies in Defense and Strategic Studies from the University of Strasbourg, France. He commanded the attack submarine USS *Oklahoma City* (SSN 723) in 1998, which was awarded the Submarine Squadron 8 Battle Efficiency "E" award and the Admiral Arleigh Burke Fleet Trophy, for being the most improved ship in the Atlantic Fleet.

Following command of USS *Oklahoma City*, he would go on to command eight more times to include: Submarine Squadron 6 in Norfolk, Virginia; Submarine Group 8; Allied Submarines South; the U.S. 6th Fleet; Allied Striking and Support Forces NATO; Naval Forces Europe; Naval Forces Africa; and Allied Joint Forces Command (NATO), all headquartered in Naples, Italy. During these command tours, he participated in combat operations as the Operations Officer for Joint Task Force Odyssey Dawn (Libya) in 2011 and Commander Naval Forces Europe for strike operations against Syrian chemical weapons sites in April 2018.

Throughout his career, Foggo has been a champion of the Navy as an extended arm of diplomacy. He maintained close relationships with the U.S. ambassadors in his area of responsibility from Europe to Africa and into the Middle East. He sponsored numerous regional ambassadors conferences at his headquarters in Naples to address security challenges in the Balkans, Mediterranean and the Black Sea regions. Throughout 2021, he taught a seminar at the Foreign Service Institute on civil-military relations for rising foreign service officers. In November 2021, Foggo was named to the American Academy of Diplomacy as one of a handful of retired flag officers who serve alongside more than 200 retired ambassadors with the common goal of enhancing American diplomacy around the globe.

Foggo is a Distinguished Fellow of the Center for European Policy Analysis and a Distinguished Fellow of the Council on Competitiveness. He is a member of the board of directors of the Olmsted Foundation and the Naval Historical Foundation. He occupies a seat on the editorial board of the Marine Corps University in Quantico, Virginia. He is also a member of the Council on Foreign Relations and the Explorer's Club of New York. Admiral Foggo sits on the Senior Military Advisors Group at the United States Institute of Peace. **Region News**

USCGC Munro (WMSL 755)







The Coast Guard Cutter Munro (WMSL 755) and crew returned home to Alameda, Monday, March 6, 2023, following a 105-day, 10,000-nautical mile Alaska patrol. Munro partnered with NOAA Office of Law Enforcement personnel to conduct 24 boardings of commercial fishing vessels with the goal of enforcing sustainable fishing practices and ensuring compliance with federal regulations. Family and Friends were there to welcome the crew members home. The Alameda and Lake Merritt Councils hosted a refreshment table (pictured at right) for family members as they waited for their loved ones and for the crew members as they disembarked.

USCGC Waesche (WMSL 751)



Coast Guard Cutter Waesche returns home following counternarcotics patrol; \$166M in contraband seized

On 31 March, WAESCHE moored up at Coast Guard Island and was welcomed by friends and family after its first Eastern Pacific counternarcotics patrol in nearly three years. WAESCHE departed for the patrol on 1 January, in the middle of the New Year's atmospheric river weather system and headed south to San Diego where it conducted some final logistics and embarked many of the temporarily attached crewmembers including a deployable team from the Pacific Tactical Law Enforcement Team. WAESCHE departed San Diego and inchopped to Joint Inter-Agency Task Force-South (JIATF-S) on the 7th of January. Unfortunately, WAESCHE had a significant engine casualty that forced it to return to San Diego for repairs.

After a few weeks in San Diego and a weeklong shakedown patrol to test the repairs, WAESCHE was able to continue its patrol. WAESCHE embarked its Helicopter Interdiction Squadron (HITRON) aviation detachment and helicopter in El Salvador, and after completing law enforcement work ups, the cutter moored in Panama for its first foreign port call since 2020. WAESCHE was moored across from a Navy destroyer, USS FARRAGUT, that was headed to the Eastern Pacific to support JIATF-S (photo above left), and the crew enjoyed some time visiting Panama City. Shortly after departing Panama WAESCHE was diverted to interdict a go fast vessel, stopping the vessel and seizing 3500 pounds of drugs and two smugglers. WAESCHE's planned logistics stop in Costa Rica was delayed, but the crew made good use of the wait by holding a swim call in the 85 degree weather. Following a short stop in Costa Rica, WAESCHE was back out on patrol running south past the equator and working with FARRAGUT and Colombian and Ecuadorian assets. WAESCHE began heading north, conducting a final port call in Huatulco, Mexico, and working with SEMAR, the Mexican Navy in conducting PASSEX (photo above center) and then rendezvoused with USCGC ACTIVE to embark contraband and smugglers seized during their cases to be offloaded in San Diego.

WAESCHE is looking forward to reconnecting with family and friends and spending some time at home. The ship and crew begin a major dockside repair in a few weeks and will start transitioning in a third of the crew this summer during transfer season.

Sea Cadet Units Grey Ghost Division and Training Ship Kearsarge



The last couple months have been very busy for Grey Ghost Division and Training Ship Kearsarge!

After attending winter trainings all over the US, cadets jumped right into practicing for the Seamanship Challenge.(pictured below). This is actually the first time several of our cadets will get to participate in this event due to it being cancelled since the COVID shutdown in 2020. Some of the challenges the cadets will team up for include close order drill, color guard, an obstacle course, knot tying, and our favorite... "Holy Ship!" which is the damage control simulator provided by Coast Guard Island.



In early March, we were able to assist with the Navy League's annual Crab Feed (pictured above). The cadets did an awesome job with serving and clean-up. They got to talk to some of the NL members and some former and current service members during their time there. Some wanted to know more about the Sea Cadets and some wanted to know what paths the cadets were wanting to take in life to give some knowledge and advice.

Of course, as soon as we are done wrapping up winter training, summer trainings start to pop up. We are now preparing cadets to once again travel around the state, country, and for some, the world. Grey Ghost Division has a couple of cadets who are applying for the International Exchange Program, which is a very detailed process and only a few cadets and officers are selected every year to go. Some of the other trainings cadets will apply to are STEM/Seaperch/Robotics, Field Operations, Photojournalism, SCUBA, Petty Officer Leadership Academy, and more!
