The Center for Maritime Strategy (CMS) is a non-profit, non-partisan research institution dedicated to studying maritime issues and their context within wider American national security policy. Through its research and analysis, external outreach, publications, and high-level events, CMS engages key stakeholders across government, academia, and industry.

Our mission is to strengthen American national security through its sea services, conducting policy-driven research, advocacy, and education on the relationship between maritime power and national security policy. Founded in January 2022, the Center supports all of the Nation's sea services, including the Navy, Marine Corps, Coast Guard, and Merchant Marine, through conducting scholarly research and analysis to drive prudent national security policies. Its inception came in response to several key national security challenges that demand revitalized maritime power:

- 1. The re-emergence of strategic competition with China and Russia.
- 2. The decline of the American maritime industrial base.
- 3. The expense and complexity of maritime platforms and systems which necessitates judicious foresight and long-term force planning.
- 4. Ever-increasing globalization driven by maritime highways and expanding sea-based infrastructure. The difficulty of achieving political consensus on Capitol Hill in an era of heightened partisan polarization. The Navy League of the United States sponsors the Center for Maritime Strategy, furnishing operational support and leveraging its 120-year history of supporting the American sea services with nearly 200 local chapters throughout the globe.



The outreach events took place in Savoonga and Kaktovik, two Artic villages in Alaska. Eighteen STRATTON crew members traveled to these villages to meet with tribal leaders and interact with local children.

The Alameda Council provided the hand crafted blankets which were given to the residents when the crew met with the native communities. The blankets were made by Navy League friends and supporters. The communities were incredibly thankful for the blankets.

In a thank you note from the SRATTON, Captain Steve Adler said: "You and your team are commended for playing an integral role in helping STRATTON accomplish the mission of native nation engagement. These engagements directly support our National Security. In these uncertain times, it has never been more important that the world knows the United States military maintains an Arctic presence. Partnership Updates

Alameda Naval Air Museum



Alameda Naval Air Station closed in 1997, after being opened in 1942. As the base drew down in employees and work, entities brought their historical documents or items to the current Naval Air Museum, located in Bldg. 77, at Alameda Point. Formerly housing the flight terminal, for passengers and cargo moving up and down the coast and around the world this 3 story building has been converted into a facility that showcases the work of Naval Air Rework Facility (NARF) and the tenant commands based at NAS. We have displays of General Jimmy Doolittle, who lived in Alameda and where his B-25's were craned aboard the USS Hornet before the raid on Tokyo in 1942. We have one of the largest exhibits of Pan Am Airways, who called Alameda home prior to the construction of the base. The network and flight paths established by Pan Am were crucial in the future operations of the Pacific Air Forces during WWII. We have a fairly decent library of many books that can be researched and viewed, including original blueprints of the base construction. We have recently added a well-managed uniform repository for donations and now have a splendid train display with an operating scale train that is nearly 20 feet long and oval track. The

piers at NAS Alameda were the terminus for the trans-continental railroad and supplied many ships with their goods needed to sail on time, including fuel and weapons. Finally, the former cafeteria on the 2nd floor is home to a 200 person capacity venue with stage and sound system for meetings, get togethers and other events with revenues supporting the operations of the museum. We could always use your help – from minor construction, repair, and painting to development and implementation of a point of sale for our gift shop. COVID was hard on many businesses but we have been able to weather that storm and look forward to more visitors as Alameda Point continues to develop and please contact us for volunteer opportunities!

WAESCHE is eagerly anticipating its upcoming operational patrol, after an extensive dockside that affected nearly every equipment system on the ship including replacement of both main propulsion diesel engine gear cases and overhauling two ships service diesel generators. The work paid off with successful shakedown trips in late November and early December. The attached photos are from the shakedown trips that included helicopter operations at sunset near the Farallon Islands and inspecting the anchor chains out to the 8th shot while anchored in San Francisco. As you can see the weather conditions were ideal for training and testing. Many of WAESCHE's crew also completed recertifications and earned qualifications that will be needed for our upcoming patrol.
